About the Market

- Setup following support from the Hovingham Community Plan of 2008-2009 and run totally by volunteers.
- The previous Hovingham Market established in 1252 by the charter of King Henry III was closed in 1854 when the steam railway arrived in Hoving ham.
- The objective of our Local Monthly Market is to champion local produce and crafts, provide Local Community Groups with the valuable opportunity to meet residents in a friendly and safe environment.
- The Market continues to be very successful, and sustainable, and provides for the immediate Ryedale area, plus welcomes visitors from North Yorkshire. York and further
- Since 2009 the Market has achieved Local and National recognition; winning 9 awards culminating in the prestigious Duke of York's Community Initiative Award

Stallholders

- The Market started with 20 stalls and now has 58 both indoors and out, selling food and crafts.
- We champion local produce and products from local businesses, with over 200 stallholders since the first Market.
- There are several examples of start-up businesses which have expanded significantly after running a stall at the Market; some now have their own successful shop and run internet based businesses.
- Some of our "Pioneer" Stallholders have been with us since the beginning.
